| August, 29-30 | | <p><u><i>2008 UCSF Practical Diagnostic Update in Gynecologic and Breast Pathology</i></u> Department: Pathology Fees: \$400 Physicians \$300 Allied Health Professional \$250 Trainees</p> <p>GYNECOLOGIC PATHOLOGY: The GYN course will provide an update and review in topics that frequently cause diagnostic difficulty. Topics include an update in evaluating and staging serous and mucinous ovarian borderline tumors; evaluating uterine mesenchymal tumors; diagnosing inflammatory and neoplastic vulvar pathology; and evaluating abnormal chorionic villi for evidence of molar pregnancy. Newly available immunostains for evaluating germ cell tumors will be discussed. An update on the 2006 ASCCP Consensus Guidelines for cervical pathology will be presented. Finally, an update in hereditary gynecologic cancer will be presented from the surgical oncologist's perspective and from the pathologist's perspective in terms of special specimen handling and predictive/ prognostic markers.</p> <p>BREAST PATHOLOGY: The breast course will provide a review of topics that frequently cause diagnostic difficulty. Topics include evaluating epithelial atypia that falls short of DCIS (flat epithelial atypia and atypical ductal hyperplasia); lobular neoplasia; papillary lesions; and neoadjuvant treated breast specimens. An update in prognostic/predictive markers for breast cancer will be provided, highlighting currently available molecular methodologies beyond routine immunohistochemical markers. A practical review of cytopathology of fine needle breast aspiration will be presented.
